

Don't have the time or inclination to go to your polling station on May 14th?

No problem: You can also cast your vote by post.

- You have to apply for a postal vote.
 - **by post** : To do this, fill out the application that was sent to you with your election notification and send it to the town hall.
 - **online**: Simply scan the QR code on the election notification or click [here](#) to access the online portal.
 - **Personally**: You can collect your postal ballot papers from the postal ballot office in the Europe room of the town hall (level E). If you want, you can also vote there on the spot (see below).
 - **Deadline** : Postal voting documents will be issued by 12 noon on the Friday before the election. Anyone who falls ill afterwards and is therefore unable to vote in the polling station can also apply for postal ballot papers up to 3 p.m. on election day.
- The electoral office will send you the postal voting documents if a valid address was given when applying for the polling card. This can also be a holiday address.
- The ballot letter must be returned in good time so that it arrives **at the correct polling station by 6 p.m. on election day** .

At the postal polling station (Rathaus): until May 12th

- You can also get your postal voting documents from the postal voting office in the town hall.
- This is located in the Europe room of the town hall (level E)
- Here you can also vote on the spot.
- You should bring your voting card **and** your **ID card or passport with you when you cast your vote** . Voting notification is not mandatory.
